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A Letter from the 2024 Foundation President

As another year draws to a close, I am excited to share with you the highlights and accomplishments of the Newburyport Education Foundation (NEF) in our annual report. Your support has been critical in fueling our mission to enhance education in the Newburyport Public School System. We are immensely grateful for your generosity, whether through financial contribution, volunteerism, or advocacy, as it has been the driving force behind our success over the years.

We are embarking on another year of transformative work, providing essential resources and opportunities aligned to the strategic priorities throughout the district. In 2024, we are focused on several key initiatives designed to address the evolving needs of the education landscape, including;

- Funding the NHS Integrated Arts initiative inclusive of design, construction, and studio furnishings for a high-profile video production center on the first floor of the high school.
- Upgrading the Music Tech Lab at the Molin/Nock with equipment, software, and furniture for 24 workstations.
- Supporting the Literacy Curriculum with the purchase of two 'Feed Your Mind' Book Vending Machines which will be located at the Bresnahan and the Molin.
- Need-based scholarships supporting the one-to-one technology campaign.
- Support for the 2024 International Robotic Sailing Regatta (Sailbot), hosted by Newburyport High School as the 2023 winner.
- Funding the purchase of 8 new microphones for the Performing Arts Department at the Molin/Nock.
- Continued support of the NHS Career Pathways Initiative, allowing students the ability to take college-level courses at NHS via three institutions of higher education.
- Funding the annual Visual & Performing Arts Festival, where students in all grades will display artwork and perform on the waterfront.
- Continuing our support for Teacher Partnership Grants, allowing our teachers to access support from the business community to implement innovative ideas in their classrooms.

Thank you again for your continued partnership and commitment to making a difference. Your support is not just an investment in our organization, it's an investment in the potential of every learner throughout the district.

Empowering education in our community, we funded **\$304,783** in allocations in 2023.

Thanks to our generous donors, we funded the following in 2023, allowing students in the Newburyport Public School system abundant opportunities to learn and excel.

FARBOT | \$10,752

The NEF funded two Farmbots, plus startup consumables and materials for cedar planting beds. Farmbot is an open-source CNC micro farming platform that brings coding, soil science, biology, and nutrition to the Nock. The automated “farms” will provide engaging hands-on opportunities for students with a diverse range of needs, while challenging our most competitive tech students with computer science, scientific field work, 3D printing and real-world problem solving.

NHS INTEGRATED ARTS | \$94,475

Launched in 2022, this multi-year project aims to transform the basement of NHS into a multi-media integrated arts lab. In 2022, the NEF funded the design development, iPad Pros/pencils for educators and students, and digital photography equipment. In 2023, as teacher teams continued to develop the design for the new spaces, we upgraded technology for the graphics art and video labs to support current classes as well as inspire and facilitate the implementation of integrative arts projects. These interdisciplinary projects aim to encourage students to apply communication and creative skills honed through the arts in all their subjects, and to bring inspiration and problem-solving imagination to the projects they tackle.

INCLUSIVE PLAYGROUND ACTIVITIES | \$4,790

The NEF funded four interactive panels on the Bresnahan playground to improve accessibility to all students during recess. Too often students are observed sitting out during outside play time. These panels allow abled, differently abled, temporarily injured, and those who are overstimulated by fast movement and activity to have low-key/small group interactions.

DISTRICT-WIDE INSTRUCTIONAL TECHNOLOGY COHORT | \$23,324

Launched in 2022, the goals of this new initiative are to develop a highly skilled team of innovative educators across all schools in the district, establish a strong teacher feedback loop regarding district technology, and reimagine teaching and learning for new tech-based classroom “best practices”. In 2022, a cohort of 20 educators participated in a day-long launch at Apple, then attended bi-weekly after school meetings where they learned iPad Pro instructional strategies. In 2023, a second cohort of 20 educators was added with the purchase of additional iPad Pro tablets.

LITERACY | \$61,324

In 2020, the NEF started working with the district on a 3-year Advanced Literacy Initiative

to transform literacy instruction. High-level reading instruction takes continual investment in professional development, up-to-date resources, and analysis. We have contributed support for both a new Word Study program and benchmark assessment kits. The project is now complete with the purchase of a myView Literacy K-5 ELA digital curriculum two-year software license. We also fund a Summer Reading program to prevent the ‘summer slide’ of literacy and generate student excitement in reading.

K-12 STEM MATERIALS | \$14,257

We continue to provide STEM program funds each year across all schools in the district to allow leading-edge STEM learning year over year. Our support provides the consumables that are needed for student projects.

SAILBOT COMPETITION HOSTING | \$7,276

As the 2019 winners of the International Robotic Sailing Regatta (Sailbot), Newburyport’s “prize” was hosting the next event. In June 2023, the NEF funded our team for a week-long competition against 6 universities, including Worcester Polytechnic Institute (WPI), Virginia Tech, and Cornell University. Newburyport was again victorious and will host in 2024!

K-12 VISUAL & PERFORMING ARTS FESTIVAL | \$10,845

We continue to support a yearly festival at Newburyport’s Waterfront Park. Students from all grade levels in the district are showcased as they play music, dance and perform dramatic pieces. This festival allows families, friends and the community to gather and celebrate the theater and arts.

BUILDING RELATIONSHIPS FOR APPLIED LEARNING | \$29,488

For many years, the NEF has funded Business Partnership grants in the Spring and Fall. These grants connect teachers with business partners who then work together to create meaningful educational experiences that allow students to see how their skills apply to the world of work. We also consider unique proposals that will purposely connect curriculum to the community at large. In 2023, grants included Shakespeare Actor Residency, visiting artists, poetry, Sailbot, Bresnahan Violin, pollinator garden, software to estimate the true cost of higher education, and mindfulness/yoga.

TECHNOLOGY CLUB | \$27,815

The Technology Club has been a successful club at NHS for many years. Funded by the NEF, the student technology team continues to grow,

provides hands-on learning, and builds computers that go into service in the schools. In 2023, the Club built computers to run CAD software in the Nock/Molin schools.

TOWER GARDENS | \$447

The Tower Gardens at the Bresnahan, Molin, Nock and High School began with funding from a donor many years ago. These gardens are enjoyed by students throughout the district, and are maintained by students and teachers. With the NEF’s support, materials are purchased to keep the gardens growing throughout the school year.

ONE-TO-ONE STUDENT TECHNOLOGY | \$5,990

A 1:1 program guarantees that every student has access to a reliable and agile portable device. This allows uniformity, creativity, accessibility, learning beyond the classroom walls, innovation and is an important component of the district’s “portrait of a graduate vision”. In the fall of 2023, the district initiated a lease-to-own program for iPad Air devices at NHS. The NEF supported need-based scholarships to ensure that every student/family has a pathway to invest in a device that is their own.

ADVANCED STUDIES | \$14,000

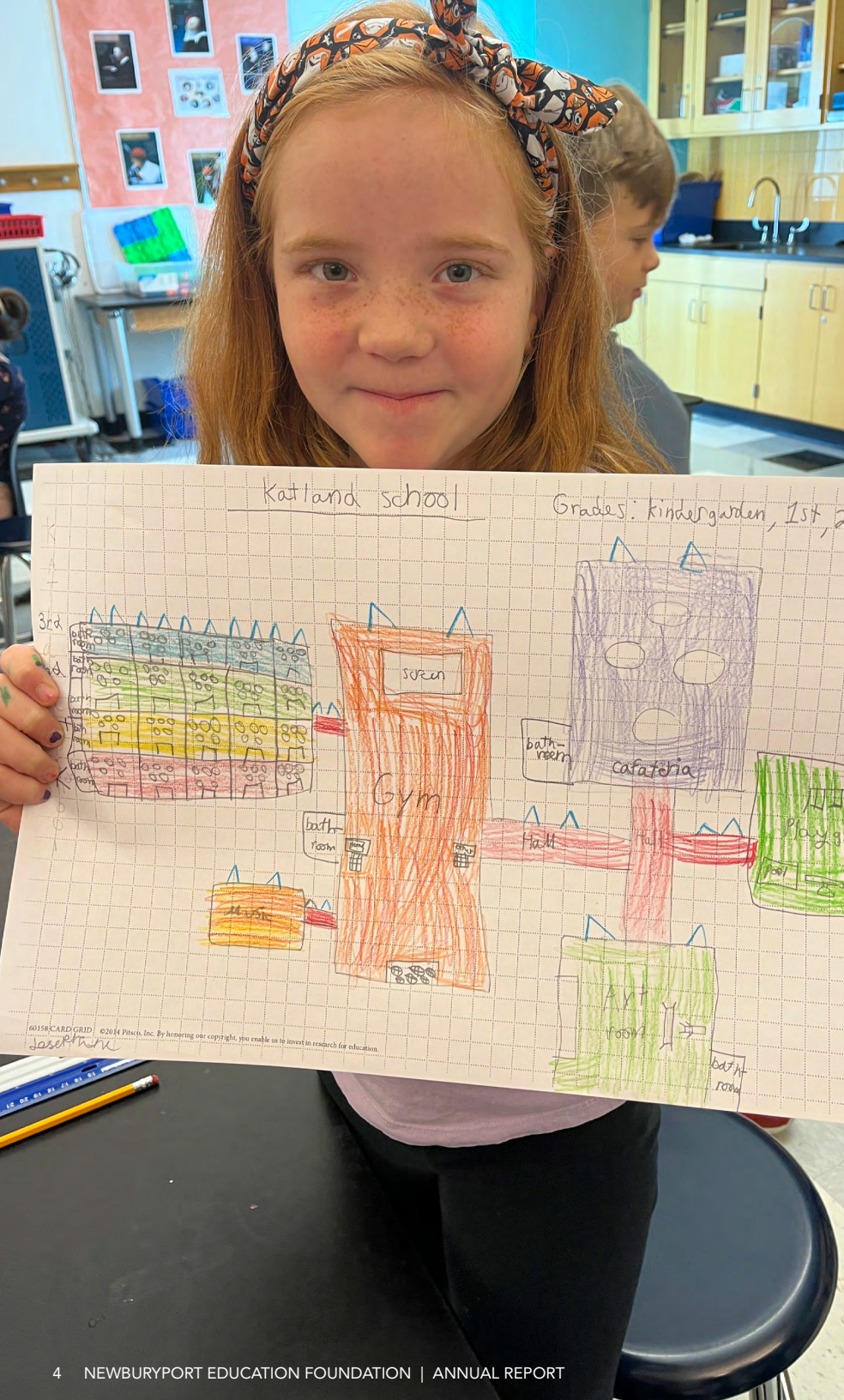
Through Endicott Community College, the NEF continues to fund a Dual Enrollment Program to allow students to earn college credit while in

high school. These early college programs are designed to blend elements of high school and college to provide students with the opportunity to experience and complete college level academic coursework. Research has shown that earning a college credential increases the likelihood of higher education completion. Students simultaneously gain exposure career opportunities and reduce the time and expense of earning a college credential. These funds also support scholarships for students who take classes at Southern NH University and Northern Essex Community College.

NHS INVESTMENT CLUB

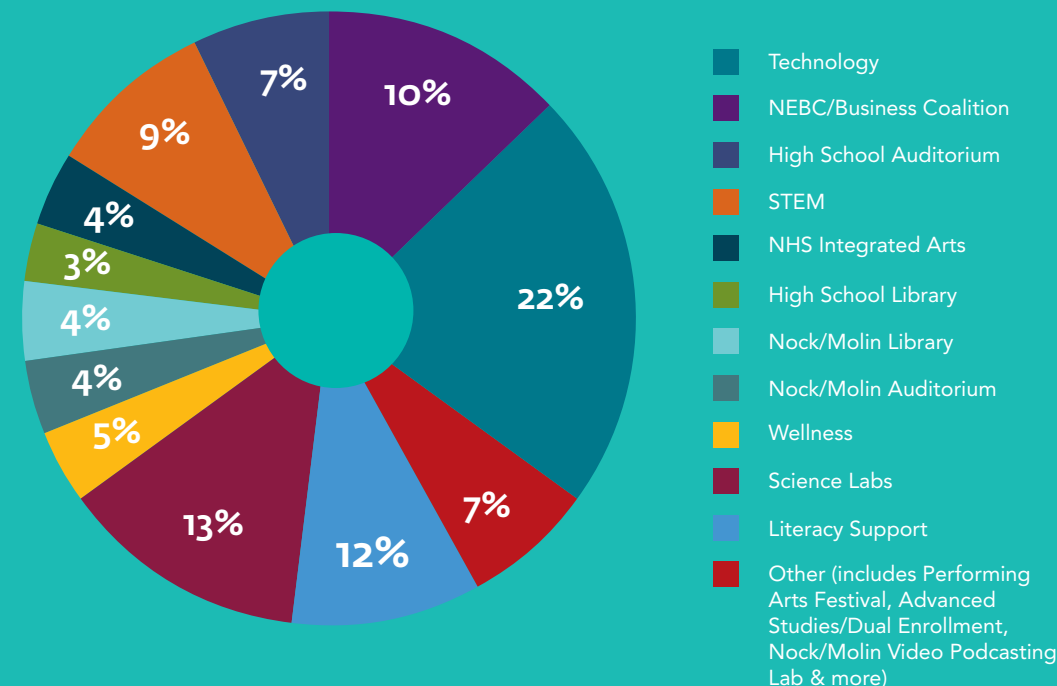
We continued our support of the Investment Club at the high school, which is believed to be the only club like it at a public school in the state. Students learn to analyze market data and overall investment strategies to purchase real stocks and bonds with the goal of growing the NEF’s quasi-endowment. NHS teacher/advisor Sean McCarthy works with students to identify possible investments. Students then present to community advisors who guide and approve their investment recommendations.

2023 NEF Award Honorees

JED PETTY, 2023 ED AWARD

The “Ed” Award is given to an individual in the community whose leadership, acts, and support have raised the level of excellence in the Newburyport Public Schools.

In the three years he was President of the NEF, Jed was dedicated to stewarding the NEF, an important volunteer role in our community and one that requires sustained attention and focus over the calendar year. His responsibilities ranged from running board meetings to speaking at events to serving on the executive committee. All of these roles are pivotal in raising funds for Newburyport’s Public Schools.

Shortly after stepping down as President, Jed volunteered to help coach the inaugural NEF-funded Investment Club at the high school. In this role, Jed continues to share his extensive investment knowledge with students. Jed has encouraged them to learn and be more conversant in the language of finance. ALICIA STEPHENSON & KATE NEWMAN, 2023 CINDY JOHNSON VOLUNTEER AWARD

The Cindy Johnson Volunteer Award is presented to an individual for his/her many devoted hours volunteer hours to support the Newburyport Education Foundation.

In 2017, Alicia created the first of many annual reports for the NEF. 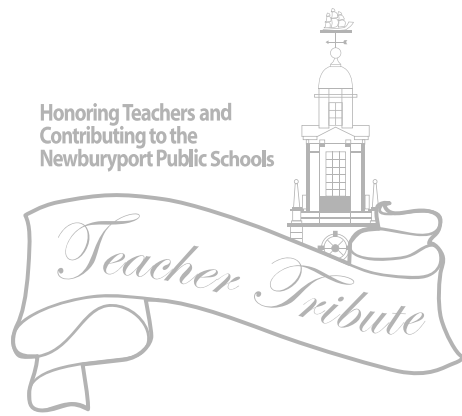
